GRANTS

Grant Writing Tips

Grant writing is a skill in and of itself. Here are some helpful tips to get started:

- Contact the foundation and have a conversation about your funding needs. Communication and relationship building is key to fundraising success.
- After your initial conversation with the foundation, begin writing your narrative early. There are often several details in the final stages of submission and putting it off until the day it's due is never a good idea!
- Create a Google doc or other working document to answer questions and work on your application that is not on the portal. This is the best way to save your work, have others proofread, etc. before submitting.
- Ask for feedback from a teacher or mentor before submitting.
- Answer each question as clearly and concisely as possible. Avoid flowery language and be sure address these topics in a straightforward way::

- How much money are you requesting?
- How will the money be spent (exactly)?
- What other sources are you using to raise funds? (Don't rely on only one source!)
- Detailed budget including revenue and expenses.

SCHOOL RESOURCES

Many universities have funding opportunities for students to help with travel, competitions, and more. A great place to start is searching your school's website for

student grant opportunities. You can also email the Dean of your school to ask about funding opportunities.

What if they don't respond?

Don't be afraid to follow up! Faculty and administrators are extremely busy and often dealing with hundreds of emails every single day. If you haven't heard back in a week, send a friendly follow up! Or better yet, stop by their office to have an in-person conversation.

Should I inquire about funding before I know the competition results?

Yes! Funding might be available to help with application fees. And it is never too early to start looking for financial assistance. Even if it turns out you don't need funding to travel to New Orleans, your ensemble may need funding to attend a summer festival or the finals of another competition. Proactive communication is key!

- Share your often (every day if possible!)

GoFundMe is a crowdfunding platform that uses the power of social networks and the internet to give people the means to raise funds. It is no cost to set up a fundraiser, however they deduct a small fee from each donation made.
